NORTH DAKOTA GENERAL ELECTION I.D REQUIREMENTS & ADDRESS VERIFICATION

NON-DRIVER I.D.

The North Dakota Department of Transportation can provide you with a Non-Driver I.D. card. Your first I.D. will be provided at no cost. Any replacement cards will cost \$8.

Find your local licensing site to get a non-driver i.d. card.

SUPPLEMENTAL DOCUMENTATION

If you do not have a physical address you may include supplemental documentation that shows your current address. Here are some documents you can use to verify:

- A current utility bill
- A current bank statement
- A check issued by a federal, state, or local government
- A paycheck; or
- A document issued by a federal, state, or local government

TRIBAL I.D. CARDS

A tribal government in North Dakota may provide a Tribal I.D. to tribal members or non-member residents living within the tribal government's jurisdiction. The following tribal ids may be presented to qualified electors:

NORTH DAKOTA GENERAL ELECTION I.D REQUIREMENTS & ADDRESS VERIFICATION

COLLEGE STUDENTS

As a college student, you may vote in North Dakota if you are:

- A citizen of the United States;
- Eighteen years or older on the day of election;
- A resident of North Dakota; and A resident who has resided in the precinct at least thirty days immediately preceding any election;
- Able to provide a North Dakota driver's license, nondriver ID, or tribal ID that includes your current residential address and date of birth.

If an individual's valid form of identification does not include all the information required in subsection 2 of NDCC §16.1- 01-04, you must provide supplemental documentation.

If you meet these qualifications, you are permitted to vote in the precinct associated with the residential address of your ID or supplemental documentation provided with your ID.

WHERE TO VOTE AS A COLLEGE STUDENT

1) Voting in Your Hometown If you attend college in your hometown and still reside at home, you vote in the precinct (voting area) of your residence. If you attend school away from your North Dakota residence and you live on or off campus, you may still vote in your hometown elections if your address is still associated to that residence. You can do this either by absentee voting or by voting in person on Election Day at your hometown precinct polling place.

2) Voting in Your College Town You may vote in your college town by updating your identification to reflect the address at which you reside while attending school. You must reside at the address for at least 30 days immediately preceding the election in order to be a resident of the precinct.

3) Voting Absentee in Your Home State If you attend college in North Dakota, but are a resident of another state, contact the state election official in your home state for information about the voter qualifications and procedures for voting absentee in your home state. In most cases, if you vote in an election in North Dakota, your residency will change from your home state to North Dakota.
